A MESSAGE FROM REV. RICHARD WHITESEL

In the spring they want to like-wise celebrate the end of the coldness and dark by throwing yet another party around the themes of sunshine and spring. This time the icons are bunny rabbits, butterflies, and painted eggs. Christians are impacted by the ebb and flow of the seasons as well. Plus, the truth be told, we like a good party the same as everyone else.

Nonetheless, we followers of Jesus have a particular calendar of our own that aids us in tracking events that are important to us and shape our lives. The Church Year reminds us of highly significant events. It calls our attention to things that matter most. At the time of the darkest day of the year, later December, we remember and honor the incarnation of the Word of God. At the time of the Passover, a spring harvest holiday, we focus our attention on the Passion, death, burial, and resurrection of the Messiah.

Rather than bunny rabbits and flowers, we contemplate the way in which the creator God rectified the fall of humanity and creation into sin, brokenness, and death. We stand in amazement looking upon the way in which Jesus pulled all of the sin and the consequences of sin and the powers behind all that rebellion to himself on the cross, where he defeated their power, judged it, condemned it, carried it to hell and damnation. Jesus won the strategic victory. God the Father bodily raised him to new life.

Jesus then spent a short period of time, 40 days according to Luke, to remind his disciples of all that he had previously taught them. He led them to the Mount of Olives, opposite the Temple,

where he commissioned them to carry to the world the good news of God's love and great redemption. Jesus departed from his first disciples with an admonition to remain in Jerusalem until that which the Father had promised came upon them and a promise to return.

A week and a half later, the Holy Spirit descended upon the Church and it was game on.

HVAC CAMPAIGN UPDATE



HVAC FUND-

In May of 2022, your church council voted to begin a capital fund with the intention of replacing the church's HVAC system as needed. Our heating and air conditioning has had problems for a few years. Lack of available parts for the current unit complicates the

repairing of the unit.

The good news is all of the units are currently working. The two main units are holding their own but are not working at full efficiency. HVAC units are subject to wear on all mechanical systems.

Regular giving envelopes can be used if you wish to contribute to this fund. Simply write the amount you wish to give to HVAC FUND on the "special" line. Additional Giving Envelopes can be found on the "Welcome Table" in the Narthex.

We look forward to your donations for 2 reasons: First, to give us an efficient HVAC unit and second, to demonstrate your commitment to St. John's Lutheran Church.

The estimated cost for the 2 units (6 total) that are having problems is \$50,000 each. The total goal for this capital fund is \$100,000.

As of March 3, 2024 we have received \$11,523.00 in donations!


